

DMUSD Special Education

We offer a full continuum of special education services to eligible students in the least restrictive environment.

In order to be eligible to receive special education services, a student must meet eligibility criteria under one of the qualifying California disability categories.

Eligibility and required special education services are determined by the Individualized Education Program (IEP) team.

Qualifying Disabilities:

- Autism
- Deafness/Hearing Impairment
- Deaf-Blindness
- Emotional Disturbance
- Established Medical Disability (ages 3-5 only)
- Hard of Hearing
- Intellectual Disability
- Multiple Disabilities
- Other Health Impairment
- Orthopedic Impairment
- Specific Learning Disability
- Speech and Language Impairment
- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Vision Impairment

Support Services
Available at all Schools

Alternate Learning Curriculum (ALC)

- Special education teachers provide instruction in foundational academics using an alternate curriculum such as Unique Learning Systems.
 - Located at Del Mar Heights School

Core Content Instruction (CCI)

- Special education teachers instruct students in core content areas based on grade level standards using a modified curriculum.
 - Located at Ashley Falls School

Functional Life Skills (FLS)

- Special education teachers provide highly individualized instruction in functional and applied academics and functional life skills using an alternate curriculum.
 - Located at Sycamore Ridge School

Learning Lab

- Academic support is provided in the learning lab classroom or in the general education classroom.
 - Located at all schools.

Social-Emotional Learning Foundations (SELF)

- Special education teacher provides grade level core content instruction for students requiring therapeutic behavioral and emotional support to access curriculum.
 - Located at Sage Canyon School

Early Childhood Special Education for Eligible Children 3-5 years old

Preschool-aged students may receive language and speech services at their school of residence.

Early Childhood Functional Life Skills

- Special education staff and teacher provide individualized instruction in developmental and foundational skills.

Early Childhood Inclusion

- Inclusive model with early childhood special education teacher and general education preschool teacher providing instruction based on the preschool foundations of learning.
